



# Revealed: black and Asian cancer patients wait longer for diagnosis

**Exclusive** Racial divide linked to inequalities of survival rates in England

Black and Asian people in England have to wait longer for a cancer diagnosis than white people, with some forced to wait an extra six weeks, according to a "disturbing"

analysis of NHS waiting times. The damning review of the world's largest primary care database by the University of Exeter and the Guardian discovered minority ethnic patients waited longer than white patients in six of seven cancers studied.

Race and health leaders called the results "deeply concerning" and "absolutely unacceptable".

The analysis of 126,000 cancer cases over a decade found the median time between a white person first presenting symptoms to a GP and getting diagnosed was 55 days. For Asian

people, it was 60 days (9% longer). For black people, 61 days (11% longer).

Diagnosis delays may mean fewer treatment options while starting treatment later may also mean it is less effective - reducing the odds of survival. Previous research had already shown that minority ethnic patients have worse outcomes when it comes to some cancers in England and are less likely to report positive healthcare experiences.

Some of the differences in wait times for specific cancers are incredibly stark. The median time for white

people to get a diagnosis for oesophago-gastric cancer - of the stomach or oesophagus - is 53 days. For Asian people it is 100 days, more than six weeks on top of the median seven

weeks' wait for white people. In myeloma, the third most common type of blood cancer, the median diagnosis wait time for white people is 93 days. For black people, it is 127 days - more than a month longer.

The government and the NHS have repeatedly promised to tackle ethnic inequalities in healthcare. Experts say the findings show serious action is needed to understand how and why black and Asian people wait longer - and to prevent it from happening. "These findings are deeply worrying,"



## MEET JOHN ISAAC DANIEL

John Isaac was enslaved on a plantation owned by Thomas Daniel (1762-1854) Alderman, Mayor and Merchant Venturer of Bristol. There are numerous monuments to Thomas Daniel and his family in Bristol Cathedral including the West Rose stained glass window. Under the Abolition of Slavery Act passed by the British Government in 1833, Thomas and his brother John received over £130,000 (millions in today's money) in compensation awards for at least 4,424 enslaved people.

The living descendants of John Isaac are campaigning for a monument to commemorate these lives and all the lives of the enslaved people quantified in the British registers held in the National Archives.

These 760,000 people were the sole survivors of this brutal trade. The lack of a National monument to the victims and survivors is a human stain on modern Britain.

We share in a common view that slavery was a crime against humanity and we are working in partnership with Gloria Daniel and the descendants of John Isaac to acknowledge the lives of these men, women and children, the brutality they experienced and the legacy of racism we are left with today.

## MEET THE DESCENDANTS OF JOHN ISAAC DANIEL

We, the living and recent descendants of John Isaac who was enslaved on a plantation in Barbados owned by Thomas and John Daniel have asked Bristol Cathedral to allow us to erect a monument to honour John Isaac alongside the at least 4,424 enslaved African Caribbean people owned by these men. Between 1834 and 1836, Thomas Daniel and his brother John were awarded £130,000 (millions in today's money) in compensation for the loss of "their property" under the parliamentary Abolition of Slavery Act of 1833.

Thomas Daniel & Sons enriched themselves and their descendants through this immoral trade. Using this wealth, prestige and influence, their children were able to immortalise them in Bristol Cathedral by raising memorials and the significant West Rose window to their memory.

It is right and fitting that the direct descendants of the enslaved, advocate for the unheard voices of our ancestors and the 760,000 sole survivors of this brutal and as yet unatoned crime against humanity.



# TOPPLING THE PAST

Dangling from a JCB, the statue of a slave-owning merchant is removed after 200 years by officials – as a cultural revolution explodes across Britain

**THE** future of scores of public monuments was in doubt last night after the toppling of another statue linked to slavery. The memorial – to the 18th century slave trader Robert Milligan – was removed just days after the Colston statue was thrown into Bristol harbour. Councils around the country announced yesterday they would review public monuments to ensure they were 'appropriate'. The 1813 statue to Milligan, who had more

than 500 slaves on his Jamaican plantations, stood outside the Museum of London Docklands. But amid protests against monuments connected to slavery and colonialism, workers moved in last night to remove it.

Watched by a jubilant crowd, a JCB digger lifted it from its base before it was stowed in a lorry and driven off.








That dozen places of origin as a proportion of UK population (Dorling, LSE)
