Social and cultural events and changes in the UK in the 1970s In 1970 life expectancy for UK men was 68.7 years, and for women it was 75 years. By 2010, these figures had risen to 77.8 years for men and 81.9 years for women. Of marriages contracted in 1970, 22% had ended in divorce before the 15th wedding anniversary. Of marriages contracted in 1995, 33% had ended in divorce by the 15th anniversary.

What is The Equal Pay Act 1970?

Primarily deals with sex discrimination

 Does not deal with discrimination on any other grounds ie race, religion etc

 The Equal Pay Act operates by inserting an equality clause into a woman's contract of employment. If the contract does not include one (directly or by reference to a collective agreement or otherwise) it shall be deemed to include one.

•Can also be used by males who can identify female comparators

The Equal Pay Act came into effect

In 1975, social spending amounted to 19.4% of Gross National Product. In 1960, the figure had stood at 12.4% (of a far smaller GDP).

The first meetings of the Gay Labour Group were held, lobbying inside the Labour Party for gay liberation to be taken more seriously.

The Campaign for Homosexual Equality declared that it had six thousand members around the country.

Angela Rippon became the first ever regular woman newsreader on television, working for the BBC. It would be three years before ITV followed suit, employing Anna Ford to read the news.
